In heaven, you will sing God's praises before His throne. We don't have to wait until we get to heaven to praise Him. We can do it every day. What are some things you praise God for? _____

Day 4

Do you sing "The National Anthem" at school or at ball games? Many will place their hands over their hearts. Often the American flag is displayed. "All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name" has often been called the "National Anthem of Christendom." When we sing this song, we should sing with an attitude of respect for God. In your hymn, what did the angels do when they heard the name of Jesus?

"Prostrate" is a big word that means to lay flat, face down in adoration.

Philippians 2:10 says that "at the name of Jesus every _____ should bow in heaven and on earth and under the earth." You may not always be able to fall prostrate when you sing this song, but you could probably stand to your feet. Why don't you do that in class when you sing it this week?

While learning about your hymn I came across a wonderful story about a missionary named E.P. Scott. He was working to reach a savage tribe in a dangerous part of India. One day he found himself surrounded by a large group of warriors. Their spears were pointed straight at his heart. Thinking he might die, he reached for his violin and began playing and singing this great hymn with his eyes closed. One of the verses sings about "every tribe" giving glory to God. When he sang these words he opened his eyes and saw that they had put down their spears and some were crying. This great hymn may have saved his life and it opened the door for him to share God's love with these people.

Do you ever get scared? When you do, think about God's mighty power and love. Work on learning the words to this hymn so that it will help you when you feel afraid.
